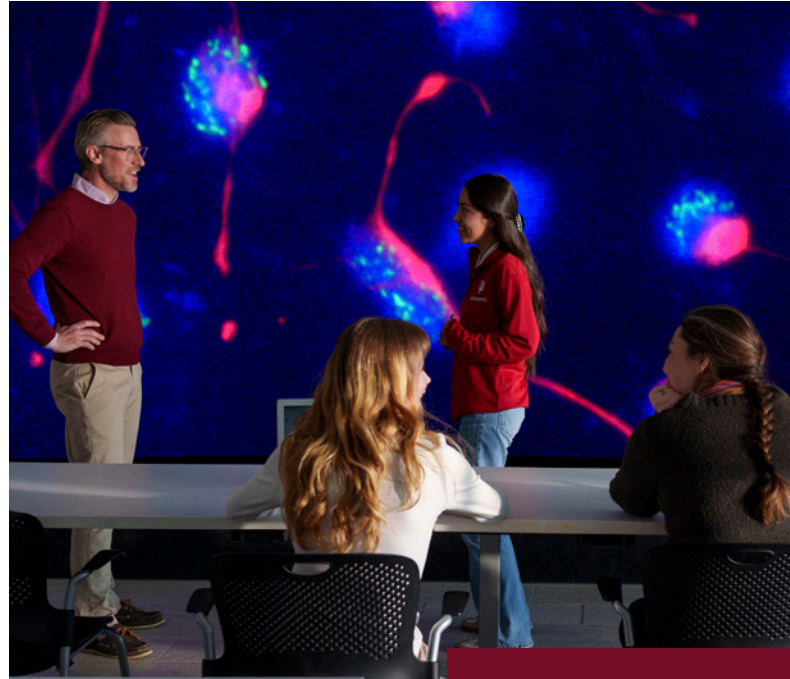

Her advice for incoming students: "Try everything. I started out afraid of fish—and now I'm building my life around diving. Follow your curiosity, and don't be afraid to pivot."

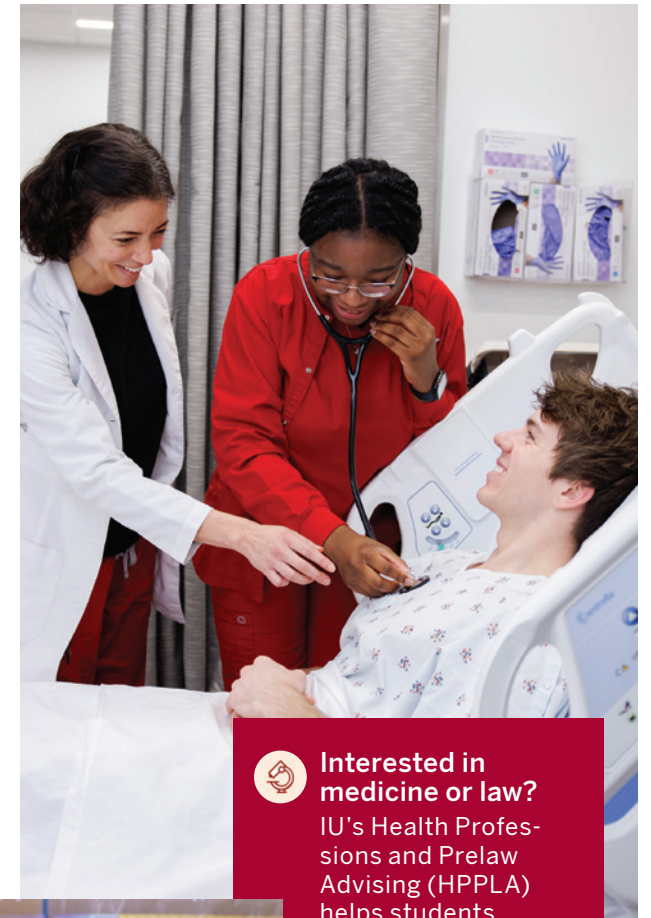
