

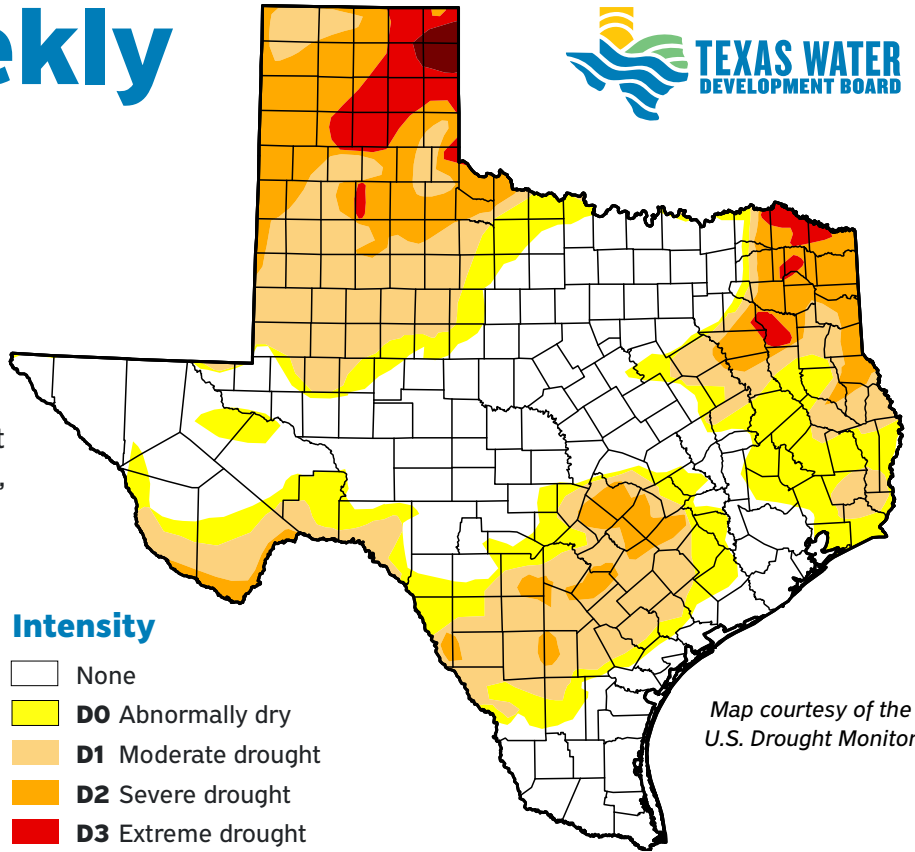

Water conditions

The latest drought map for conditions as of June 9 shows drought contraction of seven or more percentage points for the third consecutive week. Total drought area in the state has reached its smallest extent since October 2025, and with recent rains, we can expect more improvement on next week's map.

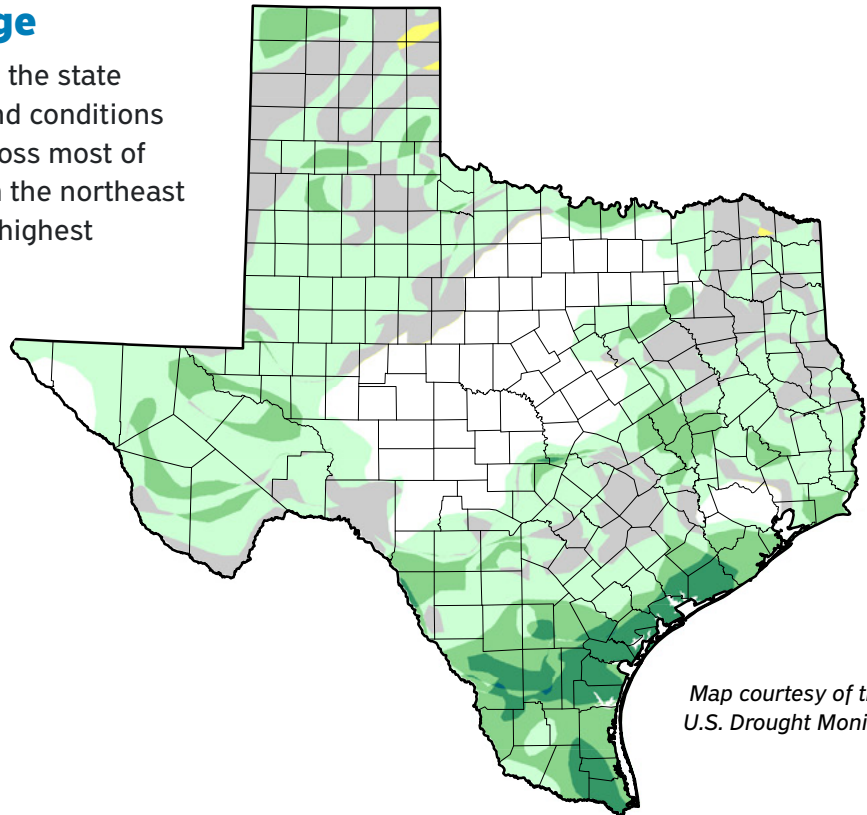

Three-week drought change

Since the middle of May, drought area in the state has contracted 24 percentage points, and conditions have improved at least one category across most of Texas. Only half a percent of the state, in the northeast corner of the Panhandle, remains in the highest intensity of drought (exceptional).
