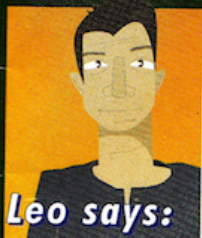


# Leo & Lucy's Advice

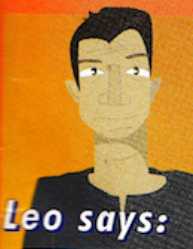


**Leo says:**
