Windows HyperTerminal Setup Instructions for Telnet Use

NOTE: If you are a Microsoft Vista OS user, you may have to download "PUTTY".

You can start HyperTerminal by clicking Start, pointing to Programs, pointing to Accessories, pointing to Communications, clicking HyperTerminal, and then double-clicking on the icon labeled Hypertrm or Hypertrm.exe. Please follow the steps below:

- 1 - A new window will open labeled "**CONNECTION DESCRIPTION**". In this window, type a name that best describes the connection (We suggest **Telnet 10001**), click the appropriate icon, if desired, then click **OK**.
- 2 - A new window will open labeled "**CONNECT TO**". At the "**CONNECT TO**" screen, move your cursor to the "**CONNECT USING**" box.
- 3 - Press the down arrow on the right of the box to select the available port "Direct to TCP/IP (Winsock)", a new window will open. Enter the IP address of the WVRC-8, then enter the port number 10001. **Note: If the WVRC-8 is behind a router or firewall, you will need to enter the IP address assigned by your ISP and open port 10001. Please check with your IT dept or PC guru.**
- ☛ **CAUTION! Leaving this port open may cause a security problem. We suggest closing this port when you have finished programming the WVRC-8.**
- 4 - Click the **OK** button.
- 5 - The WVRC-8's Main PGM menu will now open.
- 6 - Click on the **FILE** tab, then click on **Properties**.
- 7 - Click on the **SETTINGS** tab
- 8 - Click on **EMULATION** and change to **ANSI**.
- 9 - Click on the **ASCII setup tab** and then click the box "echo typed characters locally".
- 10 - Click the **OK** button **TWICE**.
- 11 - Click on **FILE**, then click **SAVE**.
- 12 - HyperTerminal is now ready.
- 13 - Enter the desired item number on the WVRC-8 PGM menu.
- 14 - When finished programming the WVRC-8, click the **FILE** tab, then click **EXIT**.
- 15 - Then click **YES**.
