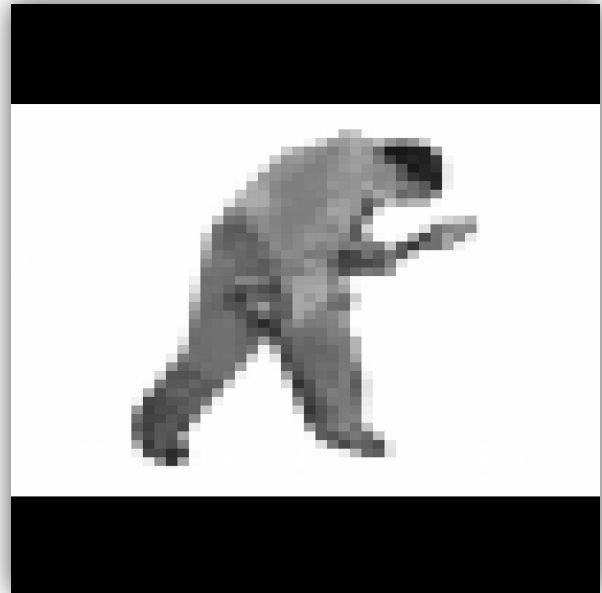

Incorporating a changed multi-tracking and overdubbing approach, 'Artificial Dissemination' offers more layers and depth to the sound, and includes songs which nod to the post-rock of Slint and The For Carnation, while also using midi-sequencing and synthesizers - this is COWMAN's most dynamic release.
