December in Lviv

Thank You for Creating a Holiday for Children

Miracles do exist. They are created not by fairy-tale characters, but by real people with big hearts — people who do not pass by, who remember that there are children nearby for whom feeling celebration and support truly matters. This holiday season, our spaces were filled with gifts, care, and attention, and we are deeply grateful to everyone who contributed. We all share one main dream — for the war to end and for children to grow up in safety. While we wait for that day, it is essential to do what is within our power: to support children and create warm, meaningful moments. Thank you to everyone who made this holiday season warmer.



Workshop “Christmas Didukh”

A family workshop dedicated to creating a traditional Christmas didukh was held at our space. Children and adults spent meaningful time together learning about Ukrainian traditions. During the workshop, participants discovered the significance of the didukh as a symbol of family lineage, memory, and the connection between generations, and created their own festive symbols. Such gatherings help make traditions more accessible and meaningful, as they are born not from explanations alone, but from shared experience and presence.



December in Cherkasy

The Light of Gratitude

On the eve of St. Nicholas Day, teenagers prepared special gifts for those who support our work. Each drawing became a small piece of gratitude and warmth, created by children who feel the care and support of adults. The participants understand that the opportunity to attend workshops, gain new knowledge, and grow in a safe environment exists thanks to compassionate people. Every donor who supports the center and the foundation becomes part of a large family that stands by children during challenging times.



Training Game “Preventing Abuse”

A training game titled “Preventing Abuse” was held for teenagers at the SviTY center. Together, participants discussed what abuse is, how to recognize harmful behavior in relationships, why certain myths are dangerous, and how to build healthy personal boundaries. Such sessions help teenagers develop a culture of respect, safety, and responsibility in relationships.



December in Khmelnytskyi

Collaboration with the Zarmilkas Brand

Teenagers participated in creating a charitable piece of jewelry. The process began with children's sketches created at the SviTY space in Lviv and continued in Khmelnytskyi, where participants worked directly with jewelry components alongside the brand's team. During a visit to the Zarmilkas showroom, the teenagers learned about the jewelry-making process and added decorative elements to motanka brooches. This collaboration gave children the experience of co-creation, an understanding of their personal contribution to a shared project, and a sense of belonging to a charitable initiative. The piece titled "Myrynka" is presented by Zarmilkas in support of the SviTY program for teenagers.



SMM Basics Workshop

In November, a practical workshop on the basics of social media marketing (SMM) took place at the SviTY space. Participants analyzed Instagram profiles, including the SviTY page, and discussed visual identity, style, and brand recognition. The most engaging part was creating and managing a profile for a cat. Theresa the cat became a star, a model, and a source of inspiration for content creation. The workshop helped teenagers develop creativity, critical thinking, and confidence in their ideas, while showing that learning can be dynamic and engaging.



December in Zhytomyr

Psychological Training “Girls Power”

The “Girls Power” training became a space for recognizing personal value, rights, and opportunities. During the sessions, participants discussed equal opportunities, self-realization, personal boundaries, and the power of one’s own voice. Practical exercises and open discussions helped build confidence, deepen self-understanding, and explore diverse life and career paths. This format supports the development of healthy self-esteem and an active life position during adolescence.



Hospital Visit on the Eve of Christmas

Visiting a hospital on the eve of Christmas became an important experience in values-based and civic education. Program participants had the opportunity to personally thank Ukrainian soldiers, поздравити them with the holidays, and present handmade gifts, including motanka dolls, Christmas decorations, symbolic souvenirs, and sweets. This experience fosters empathy, gratitude, and respect for defenders. Through personal interaction and shared traditions, participants felt a sense of responsibility, involvement, and the ability to support others not only with words, but through meaningful actions.

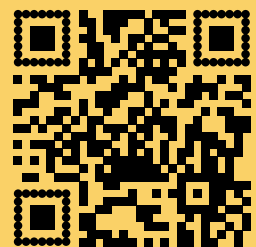
