Improving Community Health

Samaritan Health Services – a nonprofit network of hospitals, clinics and health services – is driven by our mission of building healthier communities together. We are focused on providing safe, effective and compassionate medical care to all who visit and reside in our service area, including those who are in need.

We understand that community health extends beyond the walls of our hospitals and clinics. That is why we support community based efforts to help keep people healthy and address the social determinants of health. As a nonprofit, we honor our obligation to provide health related programs and services to address critical health needs in the community — often with little or no compensation.

In 2025, Samaritan Health Services provided community benefit services valued at close to \$209 million! More than just figures on a spreadsheet, the true value of this work is found in the improved overall health and well being of our friends and neighbors who live in Oregon’s mid-Willamette Valley and central coast. This includes Benton, Lincoln and Linn counties, and portions of Marion and Polk counties.

Samaritan Health Services’ community benefit efforts fall under three main areas:

1) Uncompensated and undercompensated medical care

- Patients who qualified for financial assistance received \$12.9 million in discounted or free services.
- We provided \$11.6 million worth of essential clinical services that meet identified community needs.
- The unpaid cost of Samaritan’s public programs totaled \$176.9 million.

2) Training and research

- Samaritan provided training, internships and residencies at its five hospitals and associated clinics valued at \$10.2 million. We also conducted clinical and community health research, with results shared beyond our system.

3) Community support

- Cash and in-kind goods and services totaling \$2.4 million were granted to schools and regional nonprofit community organizations.
- Samaritan provided \$2.8 million toward community building activities designed to address the root causes of health problems.
- Free activities to improve community health were provided at a cost of \$4.4 million.

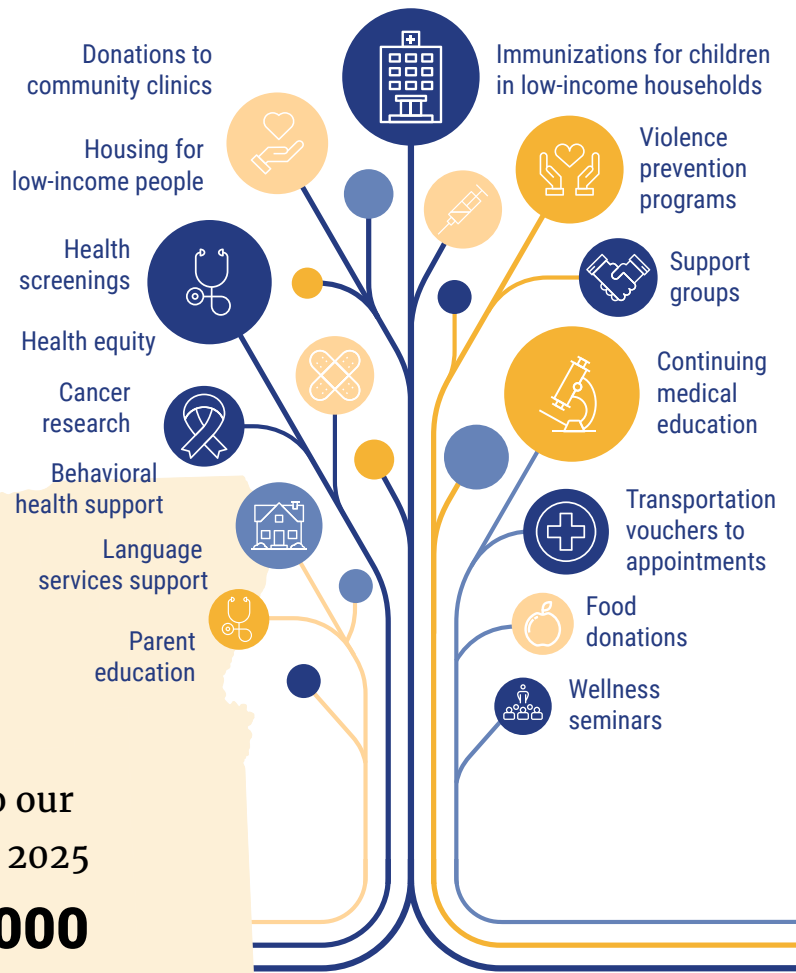


Our investments are designed to help address priorities and gaps as identified through Community Health Needs Assessments and the resulting Community Benefit Implementation Plans.
