**Cottonwood**, Fishlake NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 5). Five miles east of Beaver, UT. Timber, brush and light slash. Active fire behavior with torching, short-range spotting and short crown runs. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Wild Goose**, Fishlake NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 7). Twelve miles northeast of Fillmore, UT. Timber, brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with group torching, backing and short-range spotting. Structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Iron**, Central Area, Utah DOF. CIMT (GB Team 3). CIMT is also managing the Cherry incident. One mile northwest of Eureka, UT. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Railroad infrastructure threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

**Cherry**, West Desert District, BLM. Twenty-nine miles southwest of Santaquin, UT. Grass, brush and timber. Moderate fire behavior with wind-driven runs, flanking and single tree torching. Residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

**Babylon**, Manti-La Sal NF, USFS. CIMT (GB Team 2) mobilizing. Twenty-five miles southwest of Monticello, UT. Timber. Active fire behavior with torching, spotting and creeping. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Grapevine**, Ely District, BLM. Ten miles southeast of Caliente, NV. Timber, brush and grass. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and isolated torching. Structures threatened. Area closures in effect.

**Parsnip Peak**, Ely District, BLM. Eighteen miles northwest of Pioche, NV. Timber and brush. Extreme fire behavior with crowning, wind-driven runs and short-range spotting.

**Kinky Creek**, Bridger-Teton NF, USFS. Thirty-four miles northwest of Cora, WY. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and isolated torching. Residences threatened. Area closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Dry Canyon**, Ely District, BLM. Fourteen miles east of Pioche, NV. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

\* **Horse Head**, Desert Rivers Fire and Aviation Management Unit, BLM. Seven miles southwest of Eastland, UT. Dormant brush. Extreme fire behavior with crowning and running. Residences threatened.

**Kane Springs**, Ely District, BLM. Seventeen miles southwest of Caliente, NV. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

**Snyder**, Desert Rivers Fire and Aviation Management Unit, BLM. CIMT (RM Team 1). Thirteen miles west of Grand Junction, CO. Timber and chaparral. Extreme fire behavior with torching and spotting. Numerous residences and communication infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

**Sawmill**, Color Country Paria Unit, BLM. Forty-four miles northwest of Cedar City, UT. Dormant brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Structures threatened.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

The focus for critical fire weather will shift northeastward today as milder and calmer conditions expand from the northern Intermountain West into the Great Basin and most of the Southwest. Extreme downslope wind gusts as high as 50-80 mph will affect the mountains of Colorado and Wyoming, with high winds likely to extend into the High Plains and downwind of the Black Hills, as well. Relative humidity will generally range from 10-20% where winds are strongest, locally falling into the single digits for the lower elevations. Despite lighter winds farther south and west, dry and breezy conditions will persist, with overall improving weather for fires in southeastern Nevada, Utah, most of the West Slope and Arizona as compared to the last few days. Gusty Cascade Gap winds will continue in the Northwest, while California will see slightly drier air and a decrease in winds for most areas. Hot, dry and windy conditions will focus over the Southern Plains, where fuels are not as receptive as farther west. The rest of the northern Intermountain West will not be quite as cool as yesterday, but temperatures will remain 15-30 degrees below average for late June. Alaska will remain cool and wet with limited fire potential, while the Florida peninsula will see spotty thunderstorms and hot conditions as the Carolinas trend drier.
